Security Innovation Competition 2014 Ministries of Security & Justice and Defense

The Ministry of Security & Justice and the Ministry of Defense are organising the first ever Security Innovation Competition together. The aim is to stimulate innovation in the Netherlands by making funds available for innovative ideas and solutions related to security.

Theme: The Security Region

The competition specifically aims to stimulate innovation in SMEs. The Dutch government acknowledges the importance of innovation, especially in times of austerity when financial resources are scarce. It is important to use resources as effectively as possible. The theme of this year's edition is 'the Security Region' and 200,000 euro will be made available to further develop the winning idea.

The competition is aimed at finding solutions for:

- A) Information Management of Fire Departments
 - Make it easier to obtain information from other parts of the security chain
 - Serious gaming
- B) Combining knowledge of defense with crisis and disaster management
 - Use of drones; real time geographical information
 - Data analysis
 - Find locations of emergencies/crises
- C) Implementation and preparedness of special police units
 - Physical and virtual
 - Availability of real time information
- D) Measuring Systems for CBRN and Explosives
 - Improve work environments of first responders
 - Quick detection of CBRN-E components
- E) Applications to make Citizens more Self-Reliant

SBIR Call: Innovative Security Solutions against Drones

The Royal Netherlands Marechaussee, the National Police, and the National Coordinator of Counterterrorism and Security (NCTV) are looking for innovative solutions for protection against mobile unmanned systems (unmanned aerial vehicles or drones). As part of its 'Security through Innovation' program, the NCTV has launched a Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) track.



Main focus

SMEs are asked to come up with innovative solutions. The main focus is on finding ways to take over control, intercept or redirect, and detect the location of the person in control of such systems. However any approaches that could lead to detection, identification, and the controlled removal of unmanned systems are also welcome. SBIR is part of the Ministry of Security and Justice's new innovation policy.

Secure Your Future Multimedia Competition – Edition 2014

The Secure Your Future Multimedia Competition, organised by The Hague Security Delta, Koninklijk Instituut van Ingenieurs (KIVI), and technology magazine De Ingenieur is inviting participants to submit ideas for multimedia applications that can improve urban security.

Participants, ranging from students to entrepreneurs, are asked to invent or develop an app, game, website, video, presentation or other multimedia application. The application does not necessarily have to be fully developed. A concept or idea that is clearly explained in a presentation will also be accepted.

The winner receives 750 euro and the runner-up 350 euro. Both of them will also be assisted by the Secure Your Future partners in further developing the application into a business model, finding funds, and testing the idea in practice.

Inspiration session

On September 12 (2014) an inspiration session for the Secure Your Future Multimedia Competition will take place at The Hague Beach Stadium. During this session several parties, including Future Events, the municipality of The Hague, and the World Forum, will explain the security issues they encounter in their daily work practices.

Peter de Bruijn (Director Future Events):

“Crowd management is an important precondition for the success of events. This applies to the security of events: we want to prevent overcrowding at a single location and we want to be able to evacuate visitors as soon as possible during a calamity. Good crowd management also is a crucial factor for economic efficiency and a good atmosphere at the event.”

Jan Willem Duijzer (CIO Municipality of The Hague): *“Everyone goes to the beach every once in a while, but we often don’t realize the implications for the city when it gets really busy: traffic jams, emergency services, weather alarms, what to do if the beach is almost literally ‘full’, ‘sending’ people to quieter beaches, etcetera. As the municipality of The Hague we are very interested in multimedia applications we could use to let visitors, emergency personnel, and businesses have a secure and fun day at the beach.”*
